



FUNDING OUTDOOR RECREATION

Here's a breakdown of how the Nevada Division of Outdoor Recreation awarded over \$600,000 in outdoor infrastructure grants to 12 unique projects across the state:

Purchasing an excavator to maintain and improve facility for skiing, snowboarding, and biking, including the installation of snow-making equipment

Renovating the Lander County School District pond and surrounding area to improve recreation, education and accessibility

Installing signage on 32 miles of non-Wilderness portion of the Toiyabe Crest Trail and approximately 10 miles of feeder trails

The Nevada Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure (NORI) grant program is funded by the U.S. Economic Development Administration's Travel, Tourism, and Outdoor Recreation program, as part of the American Rescue Plan. The Nevada Division of Outdoor Recreation administers the NORI grant on behalf of the Nevada Department of Tourism and Cultural Affairs. In total, \$615,161 was allocated to outdoor recreation projects through this program.
